1. What are your views on the needs of young children (prenatal to age 5) and what specific steps would you take to address these needs?

Investing in licensure programs in colleges and universities, and building relationships between childcare providers and local organizations (schools and businesses) to make sure those programs are accessible to the families who need them. Strengthen our child tax credit and EITC for NC families.

4. What are your views on how to provide all children with access to a sound, basic education beginning in early childhood?
